### Spring term Parent/Carer meetings

This information was sent out in the last newsletter:

As a group of schools we have been lucky enough to secure funds from 'Wirral Together', courtesy of Mike Collins (local councillor for the Thingwall/Pensby ward). We are holding a car bumper sticker competition where we will invite children from all identified schools to design a car bumper sticker asking grown-ups to remember to park sensibly, in particular around our schools. Each school will identify winning entries from each year group and all finalists will then be judged by Councillor Collins, PCSO Alison Inman and representatives from Wirral's School Crossing Patrol Team. Following the judging, a first, second and third prize will be awarded. Prizes and certificates will be given to those lucky winners and the overall first prize will be made into a car bumper sticker for every family in the identified schools.

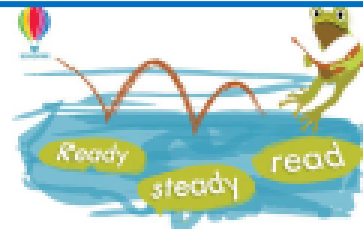
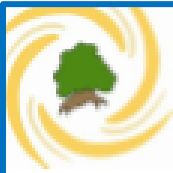
### Key Dates:

## **Big Reading Week!**

Next week is Big Reading Week. This is such an exciting week. The letter about the Readathon was shared with you just before half term. Please 'go for it' with getting sponsorship – we really need more books! A copy of the letter is below.



Dear Families,

To celebrate and encourage a lifelong love of reading at home and school, we will be running a 'Sponsored Read' between 17<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020.

The project is being organised in conjunction with our local Usborne Organiser, Claire Rowley, and all the money raised will go towards brand new books for our school.

In addition to the sponsorship money, Usborne will also donate up to 60% of the total raised in EXTRA FREE BOOKS to the school. So for every £600 raised, we will get an extra £360 in FREE Usborne books!

Please help us to enhance our reading resources for pupils by encouraging your child to spend a small amount of time each day either reading to themselves, to others, or being read to. They can read books, comics, magazines, newspapers, menus, websites, recipes, poems, leaflets, instructions – anything with words!

If you are able to support our sponsored read, please find enclosed a sponsorship form for your child and a reading log, to record the minutes they have spent reading.

After the sponsored read, please send all the sponsorship money that your child has raised to the school by 6<sup>th</sup> March 2020.

## World Book Day (or rather week) 2020

2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> March 2020

Dear families,

Reading is a big focus for our school this year so we want to make a big impact in World Book Week. We have planned a timetable of events and activities for the week beginning 2<sup>nd</sup> March, ending with 'slippers and stories' on the final Friday.

### Staff Story Sharing (daily)

Each day there will be two sessions in the hall, one for EYFS/KS1 and one for KS2. During these sessions a member of staff from each class will share their favourite book with the children.

### Stop, Drop and Read (daily)

At 3pm each day every class will stop what they are doing and just read.

### Whole-School Shared Story (daily)

Each class will take part in contributing to a whole-school story, starting with Year 6 and ending with Nursery. Each class will write a paragraph of the story and pass it on to the next class. The finished story will be shared with all the children on Friday morning.

### Book Swap - Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March

Each child is to bring an old book they no longer want or read to school on Tuesday. They will be set out in the hall and during the day each class will visit the hall and choose a different book to take home and keep. Children can only choose a new book if they have brought an old one in to swap.

### Book Token Books - Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March

On Thursday we will be asking every child to bring the new book they have purchased using their World Book Day token to school with them to share with the rest of the class. Many of the books on offer are only £1, meaning your child can get a book for FREE by visiting one of the participating retailers. The tokens were sent home today and are valid from 27<sup>th</sup> February to 29<sup>th</sup> March.

### Slippers and Stories - Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March

On Friday the children can bring their slippers and a teddy to school with them. They also need to bring their favourite book to read. The children are to wear their school uniform.
