Lunchtime news

The catering staff have been working hard for some time now to update the lunch menus. They did this by meeting with the children in Pensby and Stanley and talking to the staff and suppliers. You can imagine what a huge job that has been with over 400 children and over 100 staff across the two schools. And all this was done in their own time yet again showing their care and dedication for the children. The new menu for the whole school has been in operation this half term. The catering staff have spent time talking to the children about how it is going and as a result some amendments have been made. The amended menu is on the school website and will be emailed to you with this newsletter.

The last stage has been to look at the Deli option for KS1 and EYFS children. In the past the full Deli option, as enjoyed by the children in KS2, has simply not worked for the younger children – they can't see the options as they are smaller and when they do see them there are too many so they feel overwhelmed and take an enormous amount of time to choose what they want!

After much research and work, after half term we can offer a KS1/EYFS 'Mini Deli' The younger children can choose to make a bread roll sandwich and/or have some Deli items such as pasta, carrot, cucumber etc. They will also be able to choose a half jacket potato. The hot menu is still another option for them.

If your child wants the Deli option, you need to let a member of the classroom staff know this as you drop your child at the classroom door in the morning.

Volunteers for reading and cooking of the homeless

On the last newsletter I made a plea for volunteers to come into school and read with the children. We still need some more so please email in if you can do this for even one afternoon a week.

We didn't receive any volunteers for cooking for the homeless, which was disappointing.
