### Attendance

Whole school attendance data is currently 96.4% and is showing steady signs of improvement since last month. Individual class attendance data is shown below:

As you can see, the number of minutes lost due to late arrival can be quite significant for some children if they consistently arrive after registers have been taken. For some year groups, this is significantly higher than expected. It is important that we develop habits that prepare our children for each stage of their life and good punctuality is an essential life skill. Let's see if we can significantly improve the number of minutes lost when I next report this data.
